We hope everyone enjoyed the recent holiday season and the relatively mild winter we have had, even though it still seems to be hanging on. It appears that spring may indeed be coming soon. The INL Retired Employees Association (IREA) will be holding our popular annual spring banquet on Tuesday. April 24th. Several IREA members serve as volunteer income tax return preparers in the AARP Tax-Aide program. Free assistance with preparing and filing tax returns is again being provided by the Tax-Aide program. This year's assistance is provided at the old Grand Teton Council Boy Scout building at 574 4th Street, diagonally across from the US Post Office on 4th St. As always, it is very important to bring last year's tax return, regardless of who is preparing your tax return. The IRS and the Tax-Aide program also strongly encourage all seniors to file at least a federal tax return, even if their income is low enough that they are not required to file a return, e.g. if their income is mostly from Social Security. This reduces the likelihood of identity theft and someone else filing a false tax return with their social security number.

IREA Board Help: We encourage you to contact any of the Officers and Board members with feedback on our activities and to volunteer for any IREA committees. Please note that several officers and committee chairs are performing more than one job, so we still need additional people to serve on the Board. The work of planning and arranging IREA events and meetings, as well as providing valuable information important to retirees is becoming more difficult without an influx of new Board and committee members. If you are interested in becoming more involved in IREA activities, please call me or any of the Board members. Please also try to recruit your retiree friends to join IREA and help make our organization even more effective.

Tax Law Changes for 2018: Most of us have heard of changes to income tax laws brought about by the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of December 2017. There were several changes to the tax laws for 2018 that may affect retirees, summarized.

Standard Deduction and Personal Exemptions: In an effort to further reduce the number of people who itemize deductions, the standard deduction has been almost doubled. For example, the standard deduction for single taxpayers has been \$6500, but in 2018 will be \$12,000, and for couples it has been \$13,000, but in 2018 will be \$24,000. The standard deduction is increased by \$1300 for each person aged 65 or over and blind persons. Personal exemptions were \$4050 for each person on a tax return for 2017; however, these have been eliminated for 2018. To compensate for families with children, the child tax credit has been doubled from \$1000 to \$2000. Also, a new credit for older family dependents, such as college students, was created at \$500.

<u>State and Local Taxes:</u> A limit has been imposed on combined deductions for state and local income taxes and property taxes of \$10,000. This change likely doesn't affect Idaho residents as much as residents of states with higher property taxes and income taxes.

<u>Deductions and Adjustments Eliminated:</u> The adjustment to gross income for alimony paid is no longer allowed. Several deductions have been eliminated, including home equity loan interest, casualty and theft losses (except for federally declared disasters), unreimbursed employee expenses, tax preparation fees, and moving expenses.

Education Credits and Expenses: Education credits and the student loan interest deduction are not affected. Education expenses paid from "529" college savings plans can now also be used to cover K-12 private school expenses and private tutoring expenses.

<u>Home Sale Gain Exclusion</u>: The exclusion of home sale capital gain of \$500K (couples) and \$250K (singles) in the future will apply only if the seller(s) have lived in the home at least 5 years prior to the sale instead of the previous 2 years.

<u>Other Capital Gains Features:</u> Short-term and long-term capital gains criteria have not been changed, nor have the reduced

tax rates for long-term gains. Short-term gains are still taxed at ordinary income rates.

<u>Estate Tax Exemption:</u> The estate tax exemption has been doubled from \$5.6 million to \$11.2 million for individuals and to \$22.4 million for married couples.

<u>Marginal Tax Rates:</u> The tax rates for most taxable income brackets have been reduced, and the upper ends of some brackets have been increased. For example, the previous 15% bracket tax rate has been reduced to 12%, the 25% bracket rate has been reduced to 22%, and the 28% bracket rate has been reduced to 24%. The 10% bracket range and tax rate remain the same.

<u>Other Federal Tax Features:</u> Another tax law feature of interest to retirees has apparently not been changed. This is the ability to make tax-free distributions directly from IRAs to qualified charities (QCDs) and have them count toward meeting the required minimum distribution (RMD) for retirees aged 70.5 and over. This allowance likely still does not apply to distributions from 401(k) accounts.

<u>Idaho State Tax Features:</u> Typically Idaho adopts most federal income tax attributes, such as the adjusted gross income (AGI), the standard deduction or itemized deductions, and individual exemptions. Early on, it was determined that the federal changes to the standard deduction and itemized deductions, and the elimination of the personal exemptions would likely increase the Idaho State income taxes for most families. Thus, the Idaho Legislature is planning to reduce the Idaho income tax rate slightly and incorporate a new child tax credit of \$130 to at least partially compensate for the federal changes.

As always, retirees are encouraged to keep good records of financial transactions throughout the year to help their tax return preparer complete an accurate tax return. Idaho retirees are especially encouraged to consider reducing their Idaho taxable income by using an Idaho Medical Savings Account for paying out-of-pocket medical expenses and making deposits into Idaho Education Savings Accounts for future use by children and grandchildren in paying education expenses.

New Medicare Cards Coming Soon: Starting in April 2018, Medicare will begin mailing new cards to everyone who gets Medicare benefits. In an effort to help protect your identity, Medicare is removing Social Security numbers from Medicare cards. Instead the new cards will have a unique Medicare Number. This will happen automatically and you do not have to do anything or pay anyone to get the new card. Medicare will not call you and ask for personal information and payment so be aware of scams.

Medicare will mail your card, at no cost, to the address you have on file with the Social Security Administration. If you need to update your official mailing address, visit your online Social Security account or call 1-800-772-1213. When you get your new card, your Medicare coverage and benefits will stay the same.

If your relation who lives in another state gets their card before you; don't worry. The cards will be mailed in waves to various parts of the country starting April 2018 and concluding April 2019. The roll out schedule shows the Mountain West (that includes Idaho) to be in the sixth wave out of seven waves so it may be late 2018 before Idaho seniors receive their card. There are no established dates (except CA, AK, and HI, which occur April-June 2018).

When you get your new card, destroy your old card. Don't just toss it in the trash, shred it. If you have a separate Medicare Advantage card, keep that because you still need it for treatment. Your doctor's office or lab may need your new number so be sure to have it with you when you visit the doctor. Be sure and safeguard your new card like you would any other health insurance or credit card.

Address change or phone number: If you change your address or phone number, remember to alert HR of those changes via written notification.

Financial institution change: If you receive a monthly pension payment from INL's Retirement Plan and need to make a change in your bank account information or have a question about your deductions, contact Jason Smith, Finance POC.

If you did elect life insurance coverage: General questions about life insurance should be directed to your HR point of contact (POC).

Remember, when you retired, the insurance policy was a benefit you had to elect to take and pay for monthly from your pension check. **If you have no monthly life insurance premium deduction** from your INL monthly pension payment, you DO NOT have this insurance coverage. If you did elect this coverage, the life insurance carrier is Prudential Insurance. They can be reached at 1-800-562-9874, and INL's group

number is 44274. Be sure to contact the insurance carrier if you need to change beneficiaries on your policy. Also include life insurance contact information in your important papers so the person handling your estate has clear guidance on this policy.

When you need to contact Human Resources (HR) or Finance, we suggest that you:

- First send an email that clearly states your question be sure to include both your email address and phone number in the email text.
- Give the POCs listed above a minimum of <u>one (1) full</u> <u>business day to respond</u>. THEN call and leave a voicemail message, if you do not reach the person. In that voicemail explain that you have sent them an email detailing your question.

You will be amazed at how this approach produces positive results!!!
