FINANCE

BEA or FLUOR retirees with a Finance question but are not sure whom to contact: INL has set up a dedicated retiree finance phone number you can use to reach a human or leave a voice message 208-526-0717. A retiree-dedicated finance email box is available at retiree@inl.gov to which you can send a finance question.

RETIREE PASSING

BEA or FLUOR INL contact for retiree's family: INL has set up a dedicated phone number (208-526-0352) for your family to inform Finance and Benefits of your passing. Your family member will receive help answering their questions and guidance with any needed paperwork. Be sure to include this information in your important papers.

OTHER CHANGES YOU MIGHT NEED TO MAKE

Change to your USPS mailing address, phone number, financial institution, Federal Tax Withholding form: INL has set up a website with the forms needed to make these changes. These forms are mandatory for legal purposes. You can find them at <https://inlcareers.inl.gov/retirees>. If you change your address or phone number, alert HR of those changes via written notification. IF YOU ELECTED LIFE INSURANCE COVERAGE WHEN YOU RETIRED

General questions about life insurance should be directed to your HR point of contact.

Remember, when you retired, the insurance policy was a benefit you had to elect to take and pay for monthly from your pension check. **If you have no monthly life insurance premium deduction** from your INL monthly pension payment, you DO NOT have this insurance coverage. If you did elect this coverage, the life insurance carrier is Prudential Insurance. They can be reached at [1-800-562-9874](tel:1-800-562-9874), and INL's group number is 44274.

Be sure to contact the insurance carrier if you need to change beneficiaries on your policy. Also include life insurance contact information in your important papers so the person handling your estate has clear guidance on this policy.

When you need to contact Human Resources (HR) or Finance, we suggest that you:

- First send an email to beabenefits@inl.gov that clearly states your question – be sure to include your full name, email address, and phone number in the email text.
- You will receive an email response from an HR specialist detailing the answer within one (1) full business day (this does not include weekend days).
- If you have not received an email response after a minimum of one (1) full business day, call the POC's phone number and leave a voicemail message. In that voicemail explain that you have sent an email detailing your question.

Sending an email worked perfectly for an IREA board member when they had a question. In one business day they received clearly written guidance in the body of the email and an attachment containing the needed data!!

AARP Tax-Aide Program: Several of us in IREA serve as volunteer income tax return preparers in the AARP Tax-Aide Program. Typically we receive refresher training in January and begin preparing tax returns in February. In recent years the Idaho Falls effort has taken place in the former Boy Scouts building on 4th Street near the Post Office. However, this year's Tax-Aide Program was suspended by the national Program Office on March 13th due to concern for possible spread of the Covid-19 virus among gatherings of people. Since then, the IRS has delayed the required filing date for tax returns from April 15th to July 15th. No information has been received from the national Tax-Aide Program Office on whether the program might be resumed for a short time prior to the new July 15th filing deadline. Hopefully, most IREA members were able to file their tax returns prior to the March 13th suspension. It's very important that all seniors file at least a federal tax return every year even if they don't have taxable income, to prevent identity theft. A new, simpler tax return form for seniors, Form 1040-SR, can be used for this purpose.

SECURE Act: This act, signed into law December 20, 2019, spelled out as "Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement" has a few features of interest to retirees. First, this law raises the age at which retirees must begin taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) from their IRAs and 401(k) accounts from the previous 70½ to 72 beginning in 2020. Those who turned 70½ last year must continue to take their RMD as before. A second change under this law is that the previous age limit of 70½ for making contributions to a traditional IRA is eliminated. However, a person still must have earned income for making such contributions to an IRA. A third change under this law affects non-spouse beneficiaries of retirement accounts. Previously, such beneficiaries were allowed to 'stretch' their required annual distributions over their life expectancy. Now, most non-spouse beneficiaries must take all their RMDs by the 10th year after the original account owner passes away. The only exceptions, in addition to the spouse of the owner, are beneficiaries who are disabled or chronically ill, and beneficiaries who are within 10 years of age of the original owner.

Another change to RMDs comes as part of the recently passed CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security). In addition to the economic stimulus payments provided by this act, RMDs from retirement accounts [IRAs, 401(k)s] have been temporarily suspended for 2020. Some retirees take their RMDs monthly or quarterly during the year. Any withdrawals taken thus far will be taxable as before, but no further withdrawals will be required in 2020.

Balances for the checking account and savings account, as of 12/31/2019 were \$3,716.31 and \$4,615.47, respectively, bringing total IREA assets to a value of \$8,331.78.

Treasurer's Report - continued

Revenue increased slightly (approximately \$50) over 2018. Expenses were significantly lower (\$813) than 2018, with most the cost reduction in the area of communications. This is primarily attributed to IREA Board decisions to eliminate mailing hardcopy newsletters and post the newsletter on the IREA website. More detailed information concerning options and actions taken by the IREA Board regarding expenses can be found in all three 2019 newsletters. These changes, including the increase in annual dues, should bring spending more in line with revenue in 2020.

Idaho Legal Aid Services for All Idaho Retirees

What is Idaho Legal Aid Services, Inc.?: Idaho Legal Aid Services, Inc. (ILAS) is a nonprofit statewide law firm dedicated to providing equal access to justice for low income people through quality advocacy and education. Our goals are to help low income Idahoans:

- Escape domestic violence
- Avoid homelessness
- Obtain food, health care, and other benefits
- Educate the public on these topics

We have seven (7) offices statewide, including our local office in Idaho Falls. We are a grant and donation driven program, and provide services for the following civil issues:

- Domestic Violence
- Family Law
- Housing
- Migrant
- Native American
- Public Benefits
- Seniors

To begin the process, a potential client needs to call our statewide number at **208-746-7541** to be connected to an intake specialist. If there is an issue where we may not necessarily be of help, our local office has a referral list to local attorneys for a variety of legal issues. A referral to one of these attorneys guarantees a free 30-minute consultation.

Legal Assistance Enhancement Program Grant: We were awarded the Legal Assistance Enhancement Program (LAEP) grant, administered by the Administration for Community Living within the Department of Health and Human Services. It is a three (3) year grant starting September of 2019. The grant was written by ILAS, but incorporates the efforts of the Idaho Commission on Aging, the Area Agencies on Aging, the Attorney General's office, local healthcare providers, and many other local and regional providers.

While we typically only serve low income Idahoans, this grant allows us to help seniors on a variety of civil legal issues, without reference to a senior's income or assets, including:

- **Housing** Eviction and Age Discrimination
- **Government Benefits** Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, Dual Eligibles, Disability, Veterans' Benefits, and Food Stamps
- **Decision-Making** Defense of Guardianships, Guardianship Alternatives, Assisted Decision-Making, Advance Directives –including Powers of Attorney for Health Care and Finances
- **Estate Planning** Simple Wills and Probate
- **Family Law** Grandparent Guardianships, Protection Orders, Divorce and others.
- **Others** Age Discrimination and Elder Abuse and Neglect

Because of his skills and personality to work well with others, he was assigned to help install the first reactor in a nuclear submarine, the Nautilus. Next, he was assigned to work on the Three Mile Island nuclear residential power plant. This work then took him to Texas to manage the installation of a nuclear reactor in the first merchant ship Savannah. The country was then ready for attempts to develop nuclear rocket engines, which was done outside of Las Vegas, Nevada. His final pioneering activity involved developing alternate methods of capturing energy from nuclear reactions, he finished this work in the Tri Cities Washington.

Charles 'Chuck' T. Bernhard (93) passed away 1/30/20. He began working for American Standard Corporation and later for Westinghouse at Bettis Atomic Power Laboratory in West Mifflin, PA. He transferred with Westinghouse to the Naval Reactors Facility at the Idaho National Laboratory outside of Idaho Falls, ID, where he retired in 1988.

Patricia L. Chase (91) passed away 1/30/20. She worked at INL from 2/9/57-1/30/85 as a computer technician.
